  - b. One way to find such an article is to go through the library's website.
    - i. Go to the Kelly Library's website
    - ii. Choose either E-Journals By Tile or A-Z Databases
    - iii. Spend a few moments finding an article on something you find interesting. Try a few different search terms.
    - iv. You will likely have an easier time completing #2 if your article is relatively new (the last ten years or so).
- 2. Download a PDF version of the article and submit that along with your homework (5 points)

Now that you have found the article, type the answers to these questions below. Be sure to properly cite the academic article at the top of your page.

- 2. Identify the major parts of the article (adapted from Question #7 p. 23 in Kellstedt and Whitten)
  - a. What is the dependent variable (s)? (20 points)
  - b. What are all of the independent variables? (10 points)
  - c. What is the independent variable that the researcher cares most about? The variable that the theory employs? (20 points)
  - d. What is the causal theory that connects the independent variable to the dependent variable? (20 points)
  - e. Does this theory seem reasonable to you? Why? (10 points)
  - f. How does the author depict her findings? Graphically? In paragraph form? (5 points)

Your homework will be **typed**, and it will include the proper citation information for your chosen article in APA format and all answers to #2.
